ISTEP science exam base-year results released

P-H-M's numbers strong; South Bend schools' well below state average

Results for ISTEP's base-year science exam were released Thursday by the Indiana Department of Education.

The test was given statewide to fifth-grade students in September 2003. It is the first time a science component has been included on the ISTEP exam.

The ISTEP also tests mathematics and English/language arts. Those results were released in December 2003.

According to the Department of Education, 61 percent of the more than 78,000 fifth-graders tested passed the science portion.

"The results provide us with data that will serve as Indiana's base line," said Suellen Reed, superintendent of public instruction. "This base line allows our educators and school boards to examine growth and detect weakness in a manner that can be clearly identified from year to year. ..."

ISTEP science

A science portion of the ISTEP test was given for the first time in September 2003 to fifth-graders statewide. School-by-school ISTEP science test results for South Bend and Mishawaka schools:

ISTEP science results will become part of the state's accountability standard.

The highest score possible for the gradefive science test was 780. The minimum score for passing was 479.

Of the three largest school systems in St. Joseph County, only Penn-Harris-Madison exceeded the state passing average for science. Of the 823 P-H-M fifth-graders tested, 75 percent passed.

Both Madison and Prairie Vista elementary schools had passing rates of 92 percent. Northpoint and Mary Frank had passing rates of 89 and 88 percent, respectively.

None of P-H-M's 12 elementary schools had a passing rate below 60 percent.

At School City of Mishawaka, 54 percent of the 377 students tested passed.

Twin Branch Elementary had the system's highest passing rate at 69 percent.

Only 41 percent of the 1,523 students tested in the South Bend Community School Corp. passed.

LaSalle Intermediate Academy, a magnet school for grades five through eight, had the corporation's best passing rate at 87 percent. The next best was Clay Intermediate Center at 51 percent.

Of the 10 intermediate schools in the system, only LaSalle and Clay had passing rates above 50 percent. At half of the schools, fewer than 40 percent of students passed. Only 18 percent of the 164 fifthgraders at Navarre Intermediate passed.

Of the area schools in the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend, Corpus Christi School in South Bend had the passing rate of 96 percent, the highest in the county. Christ the King School in South Bend had a
