

## **Stereotype Stories**

These stories are designed to elicit social stereotypes. After all of the stories are the memory probe items. These assess whether people can remember what was in the story. There are four versions of each probe. These are V = Verbatim, P = paraphrase, I = inference, and W = wrong. These data would then be submitted to a Schmalhofer and Glavanov analysis.
