

How to access Maple 9 on a Sun workstation in a cluster

Since Maple 7 is the default version of Maple on the cluster machines, you have to do something special to use Maple 9. There are two methods. One is to give the command

```
module load maple/9.0
```

Once you do that, Maple 9 will be your default. You can set things up so that the command is automatically given, by adding the line

```
module load maple/9.0
```

to your `.cshrc` file (assuming you use `csh` as your shell).

Then you give the command

```
xmaple
```

If you find this too slow, you can use the “classic worksheet” interface (which is not as nice as the new one) by giving the command

```
maple -cw
```

The second method is to give the command

```
/usr/local/src/maple9/bin/xmaple
```

or if you want the “classic worksheet”

```
/usr/local/src/maple9/bin/maple -cw
```

You can create an alias or a shell script for these commands so you don't have to type so much each time.
