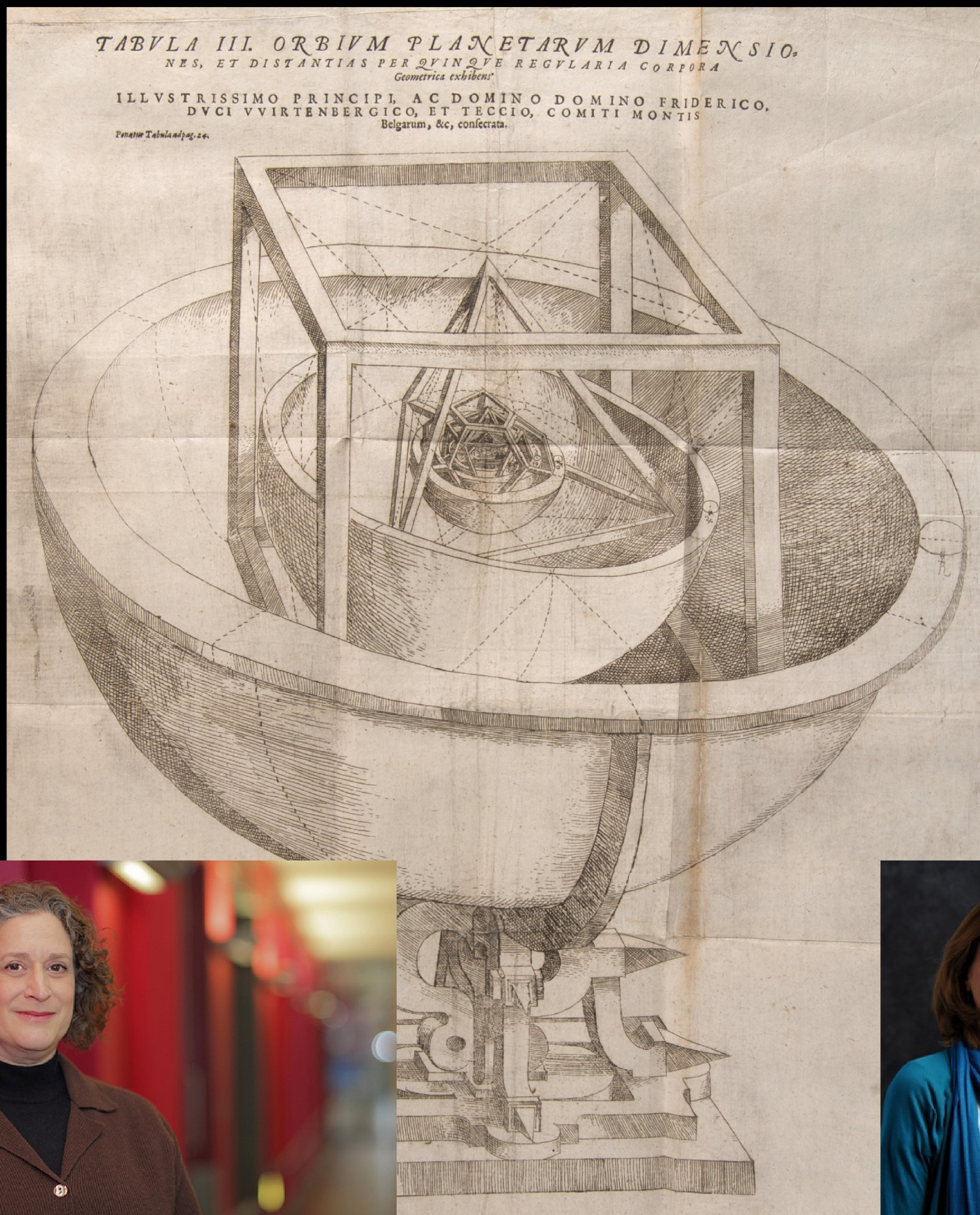

## “Three Astronomers Philosophize: Ptolemy, Kepler, and Rees”
