A message from our director, Alex, five days before Christmas:

Dear Chorale Alums, Fans, and Family,

With the students of Chorale busy last week with exams and now home for Christmas break, I have taken the opportunity to write a special issue of the Chorale Newsletter myself. I want especially to let all our alums know well in advance about the Chorale's forthcoming **Winter Tour in January 2017**. You may remember that the last newsletter promised this update, which lists all of our concert venues on the tour.

Patrick Tingleff, one of this year's two tour commissioners (the other is Becca Fritz), was last year's treasurer. As master of the finances, he realized that we could pull off a winter tour to Georgia and Florida, even though in doing so we would incur the substantial extra expense of airfares. He and Becca have done it. Here are all the concert times and places:

If you live near any of these churches or happen to be visiting nearby, we hope that you will come hear the current incarnation of Chorale and will join us at the end to sing some school songs!

Our *Messiah* performances on campus earlier this month were particularly memorable.



For the second year in a row the choir and soloists (some drawn from the undergraduate ranks of the Chorale, some drawn from the graduate student ranks of the Sacred Music Program) were supported by the Festival Baroque Orchestra, the name we have given to the instrumental ensemble that exists solely to perform with the Chorale on campus. It's a little hard to see in the photos, but the Festival Baroque Orchestra included two long valveless trumpets and just one Baroque oboe, which may have been Handel's original intent. Instead of a double bass, we had a young professional from Cleveland playing a five-string violone. That's our wonderful Päivi at the harpsichord.



Four of the six Baroque violinists were undergraduates who showed an amazing aptitude for instruments that are slightly smaller than their modern counterparts, strung with gut rather than steel, played with lightweight Baroque bows, and tuned a half-step lower than modern instruments. Our professional concertmaster, Daniel Stein from IU Bloomington, is a consummate Baroque artist (he also plays modern violin, Klezmer music, and a wide range of traditional and contemporary Tango repertoire from Brazil). He was as thrilled as we were with the great sound our small Baroque orchestra made, with remarkably little time for the four students to master their new instruments. I am the one slouched in the plaid sofa chair, which the DPAC staff for some reason situated clashingly in front of the Christmas tree in the foyer. This was taken just after the performance, which ends with the rousing "Hallelujah Chorus." (Our performance was so rousing I think my heart may still have been racing from the excitement.)




Below is the poster for this year's *Messiah*. The photo is from the Chorale's 2011 trip to Rome. In it we are performing for a full house in the Chiesa di Sant'Ignazio di Loyola, with its stunning huge paintings in the sanctuary by Andrea Pozzo, S.J., ca. 1650.



So uplifting was this year's experience of performing *Messiah* with the Festival Baroque Orchestra that we have decided to assemble the ensemble again for our spring concert on April 1, 2017, when the plan is to perform Handel's *Zadok the Priest*, J. S. Bach's Cantata 10 (the "German Magnificat"), a newly commissioned piece, and the wonderful final chorus from Handel's *Messiah*, which we never get to sing in our December performances.

If you received our last newsletter, you know that on November 4 we premiered an *a cappella* work titled "Lux Aeterna" by composer Stefan Girardet. It was an extremely difficult piece, but effective and well performed by the Chorale, reinforced for the premiere by four graduate singers from the Sacred Music Program. This is what the poster for that event looked like.



Perhaps you would be interested to see some other recent posters. Like the one above, each attempts to give an impression of what the repertoire for that particular concert will be like. Last spring we featured music based on traditional tunes from the Old World. Many of the tunes are listed in yellow type just above the photo of Urquhart Castle on Scotland's Loch Ness. The reason for a photo of a Scottish landmark is explained by the inclusion in the program of six tunes from Scotland, some of them in arrangements by Beethoven and Schumann. We also included a number of Irish tunes sung in Irish. We had help in learning the pronunciation of the Scottish and Irish languages from professors in the other departments of the University who kindly came to our rehearsals and taught us how to make the exotic sounds.


