In this class, we've talked about a number of different topics. In your last paper, I'd like you to answer the following questions:

What part of the course most challenged beliefs you had coming into the course? What were those beliefs? Did they change as a result of the arguments you encountered? If so, why? If not, why not?

This paper is part autobiography, and part philosophy. It should be a record of the way that your views changed (or didn't change). But it should also explain clearly the argument or arguments which led you reconsider your beliefs, and say clearly why in the end you were or were not convinced by those arguments. You should feel free to discuss multiple arguments if multiple arguments played a role in your decision about what to believe.

While you can write more or less as needed, a rough guideline would be a total paper length of 4-5 pages, double-spaced.

The paper should be handed in as an email attachment to your TA.
