



Physicians at New York's Mt. Sinai Medical School have determined that approximately 8 % (48,000) to 40 % (240,000) of annual U.S. cancer deaths are from workplace exposures to pollutants. Agricultural workers bear some of the highest pollution burdens, from pesticides, and children of migrant workers are at special risk because many child-labor and other labor laws do not apply to agricultural employees.
