

- On page 377, I cite Bourdieu’s essay “Intellectual Field and Creative Project” as having been published in English in 1968. The correct year is 1969.
- On page 378 the first definition of habitus from *Outline of a Theory of Practice* is referenced as (1977: p. 95). The correct page numbers for this definition are (1977: p. 82-83) of the Cambridge University Press translation.
- On footnote 15, page 389, I make the claim that Benoit Mandelbrot, the developer of fractal geometry was a member of the Bourbaki group of French mathematicians. This is flat wrong. It was his uncle Szolem Mandelbrot, who was a member of this group. The younger Mandelbrot was in fact repelled by the Bourbakist penchant to think of mathematics as an isolated, “pure” discipline, removed from empirical concerns. See Weintraub and Mirowski (1994: 248) for more details on the relationship between Benoit Mandelbrot and the Bourbaki group.
- The citation to Hsueh’s (2004) article is missing from the references.
