For this review, use an identical format to that you used for the first review. Additional requirements for this review are as follows.

- The article must be over fifty years old. One source for good articles in English is the *Quarterly Journal of Applied Mathematics*. There are many others.
- The article must be one which can be defended as an important article. It should not be the first article you find in a journal that seems to be digestible. It should be, for instance, the first appearance of an idea that has had a major influence in mathematics or applied mathematics. It could be one which has been widely cited in the literature. You must offer a defense as to why this is an important article. Your defense must go beyond simple assertion that it is important and offer evidence.
- While physical problems are often a primary motivation for some good mathematics, your article should be one in which the mathematics itself takes precedence.
