Variable Definitions, nhis_alcohol.dta

The National Health Interview Survey (NHIS) is an annual survey of about 40,000 households and 90,000 individuals. It is the principle source of data about the health status of the US non-institutionalized population in the US. The survey collects some basic health data about everyone in the household then detailed information about a sampled person in the household. For example, it get self-reported health status from everyone but detailed information about drinking habits for sampled adults in the household.

This data has been harmonized across years by the IPUMS project and downloadable at ipums.org. The data set for this project has information for males and females aged 18-49 from the 2012-2016 NHIS. Below are variable definitions for the variables I've pulled for this exercise.
